

Manfred Fishedick



Prof. Dr. Ing. Manfred Fishedick is the director of the research group 1 “Future Energy and Mobility Structures” (more than 40 scientists from different disciplines incl. PhD students). In 2006 he was appointed Vice President of the Wuppertal Institute. Between February 2008 he was the acting scientific head of the institute. In November 2008 he was appointed Professor at the Schumpeter School of Business and Economics at the University of Wuppertal.

Prof. Dr.-Ing. Manfred Fishedick studied chemical technology at the University of Dortmund with emphasis on energy and environmental technologies. He earned a PhD at the University of Stuttgart (integration of renewable energies into the existing power plant system). From 1991 to 1994 Manfred Fishedick worked at the University of Stuttgart in the academic staff at the Institute of Energy Economics and the Rational Use of Energies. He joined the Wuppertal Institut since 1994 and started his work as research fellow.

Manfred Fishedick has more than 20 years experience in energy system analysis, he is adviser to the EU and the German government, author of various publications and peer reviewed articles. Manfred Fishedick is coordinating lead author for the IPCC, member of several scientific boards and amongst others gives lectures in the field of energy and environmental science (for example: at the Universities of Wuppertal and Kassel).
