**Research interest:** Jenny Palm is professor and Head of Technology and Social Change at Linköping University. Her research is interdisciplinary and she combines STS-theories (Science Technology Society) with policy analysis, governance and power relations. The research has covered energy for sustainable development in general, with focus on local and regional policy processes and how household understand and interpret public policy in everyday life. Her research also includes how to improve energy efficiency in industry by combining barriers theories with theories from the STS-field.
